WHAT IS ASSEMBLY?

La Boite Assembly is a skills development and showcase program that has been running since 2019.

In celebration of La Boite's 100th birthday in 2025, we supercharged our flagship artist development program into a six-month program inviting emerging artists aged 18+ to create a brand new short work for the stage. This long-form process is here to stay in 2026, and we're excited to invite seven writers, seven directors and fourteen actors into the company to collaborate, create and learn.

Participants will have the opportunity to work closely with like-minded peers, learn from industry mentors and La Boite staff, and engage in an increased number of specially designed skills-building masterclasses and workshops, breaking down the art of collaboration.

Culminating in two public outcomes in the Roundhouse Theatre, **ASSEMBLY** allows for long-term meaningful engagement with Australia's oldest continuously-operating theatre company, and a deeper creative process that mirrors industry processes for artists who are keen to take the next step in their careers.

> LA BOITE ASSEMBLY

By participating in Assembly, you'll have the opportunity to:

- Build your skills within a rigorous creative process, which includes creation, creative development, rehearsals and production.
- Work with and learn from La Boite artists and industry professionals.
- Create new work and form new creative relationships through collaboration with like-minded creatives.
- Showcase your skills and talent in a public performance outcome.
- Networking and mentorship opportunities.

EMERGING DIRECTORS

Emerging Directors will explore the directing process, working with text and new work, communicating with actors, writers and designers, developing a directorial vision and utilising production elements. Directors will be paired with a writer and two actors to create a ten-minute duologue for presentation in the Roundhouse Theatre.

EMERGING WRITERS

Emerging Writers will analyse the writing process through dramaturgy, drafting, creative development and editing. Participants will be paired with a director and two actors to develop a ten-minute duologue for the stage.

EMERGING ACTORS

Emerging Actors will deep-dive into the acting process, working with text, character, voice and movement, as well as being a creative collaborator. Two actors will be paired with a writer and director to realise a ten-minute duologue in the Roundhouse Theatre.



DIRECTORS

To apply for a position in the Directing stream of Assembly, you will be required to:

- Provide your contact details;
- Provide a current headshot or recent photo of yourself;
- Via written word, audio message or video, outline any relevant directing/theatre-making experience and answer the questions encapsulated in the application form.

WRITERS

To apply for a position in the Writing stream of Assembly, you will be required to:

- Provide your contact details;
- Provide a current headshot or recent photo of yourself;
- Via written word, audio message or video, outline any relevant writing/theatre-making experience and answer the questions encapsulated in the application form.
- Submit an example of your writing approx. 2-4 A4 pages, preferably theatre writing.

ACTORS

To apply for a position in the Acting stream of Assembly, you will be required to:

- Provide your contact details;
- Provide a current headshot or recent photo of yourself;
- Via written word, audio message or video, outline any relevant acting/theatre-making experience and answer the questions encapsulated in the application form.
- Submit a self-tape of a monologue approx. 1-3 minutes (preferably a contemporary theatre work).

NOTES

La Boite loosely defines 'emerging' as artists who are in the first five years of their practice in a specific art-form. For example, you may have just graduated from your university course and been in the sector for one year. Alternatively, you may have been an Actor for 25 years, but have only just started practicing as a playwright in the last three years. There is no age-limit for this program.

Please also note that we are happy to consider applications from participants who have completed the Assembly program previously, as long form investment is important to us.

La Boite is committed to ensuring access to our programs. For any applicants that have access requirements, please let us know upon application submission and we'll do our best to accommodate specific needs.
