

DANIEL EVANS DIRECTOR

Thirty five years after its original production at Griffin Theatre, Michael Gow's Away exploded from the The Stables small corner onto bigger stages - across the country - where it has weaved its way since 1986 through school halls and mainstages - surviving evolutions in dramatic form and seismic socio-cultural shifts - to 2021 where it still speaks with sparkling clarity about who we were and who we are, right now.

In his third-ever play Gow caught lightning in a bottle: the promise and turbulence of late-1960s Australia refracted through the Christmas holiday of three seemingly disparate families each of whom are drawn from deep suburbia to our shimmering coast-line; at first by yuletide obligation and then ... well, as if by magic. This tiny summer moment, in these very small and ordinary Australian lives, purposefully uses the structure of a Shakespearean tragedy and Mendelssohn's ubiquitous Midsummer score - to remind us that the small and the ordinary are just as beautiful and worthy of our admiration as any Classic and every life is filled, on occasion, with moments of breathtaking poetry and heartbreaking sorrow.

This is a work about many things: life and death, joy and pain, love and loneliness, the presumption of youth and the privilege of ageing, being here and, then, being someplace else, somewhere others can't follow; away. For me, this is a play about transformation. It's about the storms we're each dealt and the sheer mettle it takes to get up and get going again. And it's about theatre's role in how we 'get up'. The stories we tell to ourselves and to each other that can help us through, the way they take our hand and let us walk again. And that's why, 35 years later after its original production and some 14 years since its La Boite Theatre premiere: this play is back.

On behalf of the entire cast and crew, we thank you for being here to share in creating this story with us. If the events of the past 2 years have taught me anything: it's that you are as much a part of this as we are. We need your breath, your heart - and, for the next two hours - your memories of summer, of Christmas, of your favourite beach (you know the one).

You will always complete the story.


SEAN DOW (he/him) JIM, HOTEL GUEST, STUDENT

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












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
