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# COMPANY PROFILE


La Boite is Australia's longest continuously running theatre company, celebrating its 100<sup>th</sup> year of operation in 2025. Its mission is to create **powerful connections between artist and audiences** through stories that entertain, move, empower, surprise and transfix.

As Brisbane's second tier theatre company, La Boite plays a crucial role in the local, state and national arts sector, as an **incubator and producer of new work**. La Boite is committed to ensuring the sustainability of Brisbanebased arts practice, from emerging to established practitioners, producers, and arts managers. La Boite has a rich history of excellence, integrity, resilience and ingenuity. Much has changed over that time but **La Boite's appetite for development, transformation and renewal remains the same.** La Boite has a proud reputation for developing artists and audiences with a clear purpose to push boundaries of theatre and create pathways for local and national artists on mainstream stages in Brisbane and beyond.

La Boite understands that the stories, ideas and voices of our city and country are many and varied and as such seeks to represent and engage in this rich diversity of form, ideas, ethnicity, gender and identity.

### ACKNOWELDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

At La Boite Theatre, we acknowledge the traditional custodians of the land on which we work – the Turrbal and Jagera people. We pay our respects to their Elders past, present, and emerging. We honour the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, the First Australians, whose lands, winds and waters we all now share, and their ancient and enduring cultures. This country was home to storytelling long before La Boite and we are grateful for the privilege of sharing our stories today. This always was, and always will be, Aboriginal land. We engage with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, supporting their right to self-determine artistic identity, while promoting artists and emerging talent, audience development and community engagement.



# CHAIR'S REPORT

If 2020 was the year we all held our collective breaths, 2021 was the year we exhaled - and in the process breathed life back into our theatre, our precinct and our industry. 2021 was still a difficult year, but the strength and resolve that is built into the La Boite DNA, again pushed us to new levels.

I have spoken in previous annual reports about longevity being the product of reinvention existing alongside continuity. In 2021, La Boite necessarily had to reinvent, to be agile and to reimagine ways to recover from the restrictions of mainstage productions.

So we took the party outside and into the forecourt, enlivening the space outside the theatre with art, energy, music and community with the now famous La Boite Block Parties. We also took our show on the road, continuing to expand the reach of La Boite into regional Queensland and further afield. And of course, in between the interruptions of COVID, we staged some breathtaking theatre, divided into three Acts and including the raw emotion of Naked & Screaming, the genius of Steven Oliver in Bigger & Blacker, the power of youth in The Time is Now, an unfortunately truncated Caesar and a triumphant new production of Michael Gow's classic Away.

The production of Away was a milestone in more ways than one. After two years of cutbacks and setbacks, *Away* saw a cast of 11 actors on stage swirling around the Roundhouse and, importantly, showcased the members of the landmark La Boite Artist Company.

In one of the boldest moves in its 96 year history, La Boite established the La Boite Artists Company, a diverse collective of 22 actors and theatre-makers supported by the Australian Government's Arts and Cultural Development Program RISE fund investment of almost \$1million over 18 months. The La Boite Artists Company arose from the largest single grant ever received by the company and it has allowed La Boite to provide direct support to artists and theatre-makers in a time when that support is more critical than ever.

As well as being overwhelmingly grateful for the support of the RISE fund, I am so proud of the La Boite team, and in particular Executive Director Zohar Spatz, for showing the vision and foresight to turn this dream into a reality. When looking back on 2021, I do think it will be characterised as the year that our supporters stood even taller behind La Boite and pushed us forward, again. Thanks to Arts Queensland, the Australia Council and the Brisbane City Council who were instrumental in our achievements. There was also a record amount of donations received during 2021 and this was truly a humbling show of support. Thank you as well to all of our sponsors and presenting partners who continued to stand by La Boite during another year of uncertainty.

And finally, thank you for the support provided by our management, our staff, our volunteers, our artists and theatremakers, our Board and our audiences. You have all given to La Boite so much more than you think and are so much more important than you will ever know. But the one thing you can count on is that La Boite will continue to create breathtaking theatre for many years to come.

# CEO/ED REPORT

An incredible year of change and challenges.

We entered 2021 with hope and optimism that we would overcome the pandemic however, we continued to wrestle with the impacts of COVID-19 and its new strain Omicron as well as a delayed vaccine roll out, border closures, masks, social distancing, capacity guidelines and business interruption.

In a year with global, national and local obstacles, I am proud that La Boite Theatre put collaboration, community and relationships first. After twelve months with no mainstage productions, we welcomed audiences and artists into the Roundhouse Theatre with emotional, adventurous, and vital Australian stories. Mindful risk-taking and creativity has helped us establish ongoing programs and partnerships that will propel us into the future. Building on La Boite's long history of resilience and ingenuity, La Boite prioritised innovation, sector sustainability, and growth through the establishment of the *La Boite Artist Company*, centering artists at the core of the company.

While much of the year was disrupted, sliding in and out of lockdowns, each time we gathered with our audiences, we celebrated our ability to commune. 2021 was launched in Acts, supporting the company to be responsive and adjust to disruptions. Each Act included our newly visioned HWY (Artist Development program) which became a rolling program of activities including play readings, showings, events and artist talks bringing audiences into the precinct. Our forecourt came alive with artworks, performance and spoken word through *dhagun*, Blaklash Creative's curated program of some of Australia's finest contemporary Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists responses to Country and Belonging.

We end 2021 knowing the future of storytelling is safe with a strong pipeline of 18 works ending the year in development. A national partnership established with Australia Play Transforms, La Boite will continue to develop and present critical stories that champion diversity and celebrate stories from across Australia.


Since March 2020, La Boite has been responding to the evolving situation of the COVID-19 outbreak. 2021 was no different with ongoing business interruption.



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# THE WELCOME

With the support of the Queensland Government's Department of Local Government, Racing and Multicultural Affairs and the Commonwealth Bank, La Boite developed *The Neighbourhood* into a digital project. La Boite engaged KIOSK, a local digital media company who with the support of Screen Queensland, re-envisoned a stage play for the silver screen.

The Welcome is a life-affirming collection of short films, celebrating honest and authentic stories about migrant and refugee experiences and what it means to belong in Australia. It has been screening since 18 January 2021 across multiple digital platforms and has been distributed to International film festivals. It was screened as part of the official selection at the 28<sup>th</sup> San Diego Latino Film Festival as well inside the Australian Pavilion at the Dubai Expo 2021.

The Welcome's 10 short films with a total of 23 minutes of content across Jan – April '21 reached 15,037 viewers and 221 viewing hours on YouTube. As per the brief from Multicultural Affairs Queensland, 75% of its audiences have been based in regional Australia, with the highest viewers from Queensland.

As we respond to the COVID-19 crisis, we are first and foremost responsible for the welfare of arts workers. Independent artists and creatives are the most vulnerable within the arts sector and La Boite recognises that we have a responsibility to champion, support, and engage Brisbane's freelance artists and theatre-makers by providing opportunities for employment in 2021 and beyond.

Artists, including actors, a range of creatives (directors, designers, writers etc.) and crew (stage managers, technicians etc), are at the forefront of La Boite's thinking and day to day operations as a theatre company. The theatre-makers that we employ are fundamental to our vision, mission, and ongoing strategy as producers of new work and culturally informed practice. The La Boite Artist Company ensures that artists, representation, relevance, and innovation remain at the forefront of our creative output in a future when the world urgently needs deeply engaged, passionate, and vital storytelling.

Funded by an investment of almost \$1M through the Australian Government's Arts and Cultural Development Program Restart Investment to Sustain and Expand (RISE) fund, across an 18 month (2021 – 2022) period we are proud to have the following artists integrated across mainstage productions, youth and education program, artist developments and a series of critical sector development conversations.

# ARTISTS IN RESIDENCE

La Boite Theatre's Artists in Residence Program is proudly supported by Brisbane City Council



*RIOT* by Michelle Law and Paul Hodge in partnership with Opera Queensland. This new musical theatre work remains in development with Director Darren Yap and Musical Director James Dobinson. In October 2021 four songs from the updated libretto were recorded to be circulated to the Hong Kong Opera and Seattle Opera.



Tiddas by Anita Heiss in partnership with QPAC. This page-to-stage adaption is undergoing a final phase of development with Director Nadine McDonald-Dowd and Dramaturg Jane Harrison. This work will premiere in La Boite's 2022 mainstage season in partnership with QPAC and Brisbane Festival.



Arthur by David Morton (Dead Puppet Society) will continue as a work in development through our HWY pipeline in 2021-22. In 2021, La Boite brought DPS together with QUT acting students to bolster the development of the work through experimentation and play. *IRL* by Lewis Treston will continue as a work in development through our HWY pipeline in 2021-22. *IRL* had its final creative development in October/November 2021, culminating with a public play reading.



YOKE, by Aha Ensemble and Danielle Constance, is a disability-led project exploring the nature of relationships. Aha Ensemble completed their first development phase in June 2021 with two public showings and YOKE remains in development for 2022.



Let's Break Up by Anisa Nandaula in partnership with BEMAC. This multidisciplinary work combining stand-up comedy, spoken word, theatre and movement remains in development with Director Ari Palani and Dramaturg Sanja Simić. The work had a public showing scheduled for November 2021 which has been postponed until March 2022.



# HWY

As part of La Boite's overarching Artist Development programs, which provides an important pipeline for new work and ideas, HWY Live showcases a suite of live performances, workshops and masterclasses, and conversations. HWY is led by a commitment to collaborative practice, an exchange of creativity and skills, an ongoing conversation about theatre in Australia, and a drive to expand our reach and diversify voices on the La Boite stage.

In partnership with Brisbane Airport Corporation and Screen QLD, HWY transitioned into a rolling program of activities, including for 2021:

- 2 specialist workshops and masterclasses
- 18 showings & play readings
- 6 conversations
- 3 dhagun exhibitions including 10 visual artists in the forecourt area

### ASSISTANT OREATIV 12s

Our Assistant Creatives Program provides individuals the opportunity to assist on one of five mainstage productions in La Boite's 2021-22 season, under the mentorship of industry professionals / the creatives who form La Boite's Artist Company.

This program is open to Brisbane-based creatives interested in set & costume design, lighting design, sound design & composition, video design, and directing.

These positions are paid, commensurate with working part-time over a four week rehearsal period. During each project, participants will shadow their chosen creatives in rehearsal, production week, and (if appropriate) throughout the season.

### MULTICULTURAL YOUTH ARTS PROGRAM

2021 marked the pilot program of The Multicultural Youth Arts Program (MYAP). Designed to provide a space for young people, aged 11-19 years, to engage in educational, recreational, and social activities that are multilingual, multicultural and multimodal.

Facilitated by La Boite's Teaching Artists and supported by Multicultural Australia and the Queensland Program of Assistance to Survivors of Torture and Trauma (QPASTT), the aim of the program is to deliver theatre workshops for young people from refugee and migrant backgrounds to foster leadership, self-expression, confidence, communication and build upon their senses of cultural identity and belonging.

The program will be delivered over the next three years, developing the next generation of diverse storytellers for our stages.

In addition to our own program, La Boite continued to welcome commercial and community venue hirers into the Roundhouse Theatre, La Boite Studio and La Boite Forecourt. # YOUTH & EDUCATION

La Boite is committed to providing educational and training experiences for school students, teachers and young and emerging artists. Through our dedicated Youth & Education arm, the company aims to connect program participants with professional artists who are at the forefront of contemporary theatre practice.

Our education programs align with the Queensland and National Drama Curriculums, striving to make our youth and education offerings as relevant to the classroom as possible.

Through passionate dedication to diversity and access, we are committed to creating programs and scholarship pathways available to those that may experience barriers to inclusion, including but not limited to:

- Long distance travel (More than 40km from La Boite)
- Low Income household and/or Low ICSEA School (score below 1000)
- Students who identify as culturally and/or linguistically diverse (CALD)
- Students who identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander (ATSI)

#### YOUNG ARTIST COMPANY

La Boite's Young Artist Company trains, showcases and connects local emerging talent within a professional theatre context. In 2021, our Young Artist Company worked for eight weeks to develop and present *The Time is Now* for nine performances in The Roundhouse Theatre.

#### \$5 ADD ON PROGRAM

Aiming to maximise students' in-theatre experience, our \$5 add-on program includes an entertaining and exclusive Q&A with cast and creatives post-show

#### STUDENT WORKSHOPS

Offered either in-theatre or in-school, our student workshops are delivered by industry professionals aligning with Style, Form & Conventions.

#### SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAM

Designed for young performers aged 13-17, to develop their passion for storytelling over 4 days during school holidays.

#### ASSEMBLY

La Boite's Assembly is a six-week skills development and showcase program, designed for twenty-one emerging artists.

Throughout the program, participants will collaborate with like-minded peers, create and develop a new work, and learn from La Boite artists through creative development workshops.

Seven directors, seven writers and seven actors are selected to participate, and work towards a public outcome. This will include 6 x masterclasses, 1 x intensive full day rehearsal culminating in a public outcome.









# DIGITAL

Throughout 2021 the company engaged Optikal Bloc to record and package together our syllabus-aligned productions and skills development workshops for teachers and students alike. These Digital Education Packages were distributed nationally, enabling La Boite to reach regional and national education markets. Recorded education resources for students and teachers, available for streaming/purchase online allows for increased access for Regional/Remote schools, as well as the expansion to a national market.

La Boite's Digital program was distributed to 36 schools across metropolitan, regional and remote Queensland.



2021 saw us continue to be tested by the ongoing impact of COVID-19 on our industry. In 2021 La Boite was grateful to our donors and their incredible support and generosity.

Their commitment to La Boite during these testing times has allowed artists to work, stories to be told on our stage, and assisted in leaving a legacy for generations to come.

#### GENERAL DONATIONS

La Boite's General Fund is supported by generous individuals who give through direct means as well as Box Office Giving. La Boite's General Fund helps us to work with passionate artists, investing in new and significant theatre, support a program of free events, and invest in renewable technologies.

#### CORPORATE PHILANTHROPY & SPONSORSHIP

La Boite's directed giving program provides our partners with the opportunity to build meaningful relationships in our venue and connect with La Boite's vibrant audiences and artists. We work closely with our partners to create a partnership that aligns the purpose of and showcases both organisations.

In addition to corporate cash Sponsorship, we received over \$421,000 of in-kind support in 2021.

We pride ourselves on our ability to create and sustain long-term partnerships; 76% of our partners have been on the journey with us for 6 years and 32% of them have been with us between 10 and 14 years. Our unique and tailor-made partnerships ensure we can offer increased opportunities for partners to grow their networks.

#### LA BOITE BURSARIES

La Boite is committed to creating outstanding experiences and opportunities for young artists and creatives, while building access and inclusion. Diversity is central to innovation, and equity is the key to unlocking its potential.

In 2021 La Boite introduced individual bursaries, allowing donors to deepen their engagement with the company through bursaries that are made available across our ASSEMBLY and Young Artist Company programs. This is a directional gift-giving program that channels their support to the area they care about most: people.

### WALL OF LIGHT

La Boite's *Wall of Light* is our way to celebrate those who celebrate us, with a highly visible and public acknowledgement in the Roundhouse Theatre Foyer. In 2021, we welcomed several new donors to our *Wall of Light* and saw many of our original donors continue their pledge for another three years. A \$2,000 tax deductible donation secures your name or acknowledgement on the *Wall of Light* for three years and may be paid in one instalment or via a payment plan.

### GIFT A TICKET

Through La Boite's *Gift A Ticket* program, a \$25 tax-deductible donation supports the future of theatre and gives the next generation of theatre-makers and audiences opportunities to experience live performance – in many cases, for the first time. In 2021 La Boite was able to provide over \$8,735 in discounted and complimentary tickets to school students and those from disadvantaged backgrounds.

### TAKE A SEAT

Our Take a Seat program celebrates the moments we share in our theatre as a community, representing the broad array of artists, arts workers, companies and impassioned theatre-goers who have supported La Boite through its 97-year legacy. Donors have chosen to give through this campaign to celebrate their love of theatre, as a gift to a loved one or as a memorial tribute to a friend or family member. Our Take a Seat program is also popular with corporate groups, whose names and logos adorn numerous rows throughout the theatre. A single tax deductible donation of \$500 secures a seat and dedication in the Roundhouse for the life of the theatre.
