

La Boite Theatre is Australia's longest continuously running theatre company, celebrating its 100th year of operation in 2025.

Located in Kelvin Grove, Brisbane, La Boite is home to the iconic 400 seat Roundhouse Theatre: one of Australia's only purpose-built theatre in-the-round.

La Boite plays a crucial role in the local, state and national arts sector as an incubator and producer of new work, with a dedicated focus on the sustainability of Brisbane-based arts practice from emerging to established practitioners, producers, and arts managers. La Boite's origins began in community and the organisation prides itself on being fiercely local. However, as we head into our second century of operation, La Boite's legacy and future-focused vision has seen it become a company of national significance.

One of the biggest challenges we face is how we continue to grow the importance and impact of the company nationally and internationally while not disenfranchising our loyal, loving, local artists.

La Boite will meet these challenges with determination, kindness and considered strategies through the crucial work we program, a targeted and dynamic marketing plan to reach new audiences and retain existing ones, and our pivotal vision of another century of changing the world, one story at a time.

As we reflect on the year gone by, I am filled with pride and optimism for what lies ahead for La Boite, Australia's oldest continuously running professional theatre company. The year 2023 was a significant milestone in our journey, characterised by reconnecting, refining and landmark achievements.

This year, we have been focused on rebuilding key relationships that are foundational to our success. It was a monumental occasion to welcome back Sydney Theatre Company (STC) as co-producers on the world premiere of *The Poison of Polygamy* by Anchuli Felicia King.

This collaboration marked STC's celebrated return after 12 years and we were honoured to premiere this ground-breaking Australian work in Brisbane before its successful transfer to Sydney, directed by Courtney Stewart in her directorial debut as La Boite Artistic Director. The production's reception was nothing short of stellar, garnering rave reviews, three Matilda Award nominations and five Sydney Theatre Award nominations – a testament to the talent and passion that drives our company.

Furthering our commitment to original, thoughtprovoking theatre, we proudly brought three world premiere Australian works to the stage. Each production echoed our dedication to storytelling that resonates and challenges, ensuring our place as a beacon of cultural significance in Australia.

This year also saw exciting changes within our leadership. We were thrilled to announce the appointment of La Boite Artistic Director, Courtney Stewart, to the Creative Australia board. Courtney's appointment is not just a personal achievement but significantly strengthens La Boite's national connections and influence.

In addition, we welcomed two new directors to our board, Sarah Townsend and Amanda Jolly, whose expertise and vision will undoubtedly propel us toward new heights. While we welcomed new faces, we also farewelled Deputy Chair Vivienne Anthon after 12 years of invaluable service. Vivienne's contribution to La Boite has been immeasurable and we extend our heartfelt thanks for her dedication and leadership.

In 2023, we continued to navigate the lingering challenges created by the impact of the pandemic. Juggling increasing operating costs, sporadic COVID outbreaks, unexpected performance cancellations and cost-of-living impacts on audiences tested our resilience. These hurdles reminded us of the unpredictable nature of the theatre industry and the importance of adaptability and perseverance – characteristics that have defined La Boite throughout its 98-year history.

Our journey this year would not have been possible without the unwavering commitment of the entire La Boite community, whose passion and creativity are the backbone of our company. Each member, from the artists to the technical and administrative staff, plays a vital role in bringing our vision to life.

Equally, our corporate partners, sponsors and donors have been key to our success. Of particular note was the success of our Plus1 matched funding campaign, supported by Arts Queensland and Creative Partnerships Australia, which attracted 392 individual donors – 78 per cent of whom were new donors to La Boite.

Your support has enabled us to push creative boundaries and enrich our community with diverse and inclusive storytelling and we are profoundly thankful for your belief in our mission.

As we edge closer to our centenary year in 2025, we have looked inward to ensure that we are future fit. This introspection is driving us to refine our processes, embrace innovation and strengthen our community engagements and partnerships, ensuring that La Boite remains a vibrant and dynamic leader in Australia's cultural landscape.

The road ahead is filled with promise. With your continued support, we stand on the cusp of a new era of storytelling that honours our rich history while boldly stepping into the future.

ARTISTIC DIRECTOR / CEO'S REPORT

COURTNEY STEWART

The indefatigable La Boite team and I have the job of upholding live performance as a way to deliver instrumental civic and social benefits. We do this by collaborating with the most exciting local and national artists and connecting them with audiences through the act of storytelling.

Last year we presented three World Premieres, which saw seven artists make their La Boite debut and 1065 audience members purchase their first ticket to a La Boite show.

While pockets of our industry have started to see the light at the end of the tunnel in terms of returning to a pre-pandemic state of operation, being small-but-mighty, we continue to navigate a new 'business as usual'.

We reignited our collaborative partnership with Sydney Theatre Company (STC) in the presentation of Anchuli Felicia King's adaptation of *The Poison of Polygamy* – our first collaboration with STC in 12 years - which played to critical acclaim both for Brisbane and Sydney audiences.

Our longstanding relationship with QPAC saw us work with some of the brightest rising artists in Brisbane to bring the formidable Aidan Rowlingson's *Capricorn* to the stage after multiple creative developments.

We also joined forces again with the nationally renowned Lewis Treston on his new work *IRL*, a work that tested our ability to stretch our resources as far as they would go to give this full-to-the-brim fever dream the production value it deserved.

Our plans to premiere *Cut Chilli* by Chenturan Aran had to pivot while we negotiated the familiar challenges of bringing new work to the stage. This was a necessary step to preserve the integrity of the Writer's vision for the work, to uphold our duty of care to the community we were trying to bring into our space to experience the story, and to honour the artists who were generously sharing parts of themselves within the work. This was an incredibly painful decision, but a critical one, and a decision that I believe wholeheartedly upholds our values as a company.

We are hurtling towards our 100th birthday – a significant milestone for our company as well as the sector. We are primed and ready to not only celebrate the achievements of the company to date, but to also cast our eyes forward and begin to lay the ground for this next chapter in our company's history.

To all of our stakeholders: our funding bodies who enable the team to turn up to work every day to drive us towards our strategic goals, to our Donors and Sponsors who enable us to support the development of our artists and create ground-breaking theatre, to our audiences who support us to test bold new work and help us to continue to solidify our legacy as the oldest and boldest theatre company in the country, to the artists we collaborate with to bring our season to the stage and so generously share their gifts with us and the community – it is the utmost privilege to work for you.



ARTIST DEVELOPMENT



DIRECTOR OBSERVERSHIPS

Over 2023, we welcomed six emerging directors into the rehearsal rooms of our Mainstage Season to observe the directorial process, learn how to bring new work to the stage and understand what it means to work with a professional theatre company. Artists benefitted from one-on-one sessions with Directors, access to the Artistic team of La Boite, uninterrupted observation and inclusion in special events such as Opening Nights.

WRITERS MEET AND GREET

In March 2023, La Boite swung open our doors to meet writers and hear their stories. We invited playwrights to meet with our Artistic team to discuss their work, their practices and look at potential development opportunities.

We received over **75** applications and met with **29** writers Australia-wide to start a dialogue about their work, forge new relationships and reignite long lost connections.

LONGHOUSE BRISBANE

In partnership with Contemporary Asian Australian Performance

In August, La Boite in partnership with CAAP (Contemporary Asian Australian Performance), held an In Conversation facilitated by Tessa Leong (in Triona Calimbayan-Giles' absence), with Courtney Stewart (Artistic Director and CEO La Boite), Katrina Irawati Graham (Screenwriter and La Boite's Resident Emerging Dramaturg) and Tarun Nagesh (Curator of Asian Art at QAGOMA).

The discussion unpacked what it means to be an Asian Australian leader in Brisbane.

This laidback event was held in La Boite's Studio with around 30 artists in attendance, where artists connected post-event over delicious Vietnamese food and refreshments.



RESIDENT EMERGING DRAMATURG

After a Queensland-wide search for this coveted position, La Boite selected screenwriter, playwright and activist Katrina Irawati Graham as our Resident Emerging Dramaturg, a role designed for an artist looking to develop their dramaturgical career. Katrina was embedded in the La Boite Artistic team across 2023 and worked under the guidance of Courtney Stewart and other industry professionals.

In this role, Katrina contributed to various La Boite programs, such as Assembly and the Artist Masterclass series, assisting in the development of La Boite's Mainstage work, and will continue working with La Boite in 2024.



SKILLS DEVELOPMENT



ARTIST MASTERCLASSES

We continued our highly successful Masterclass series in 2023 with four new events, allowing artists a peek into the process of some of Brisbane's brightest. ASSEMBLY

Entering its fifth year in 2023, La Boite's Assembly is a 10-week skills developments and showcase program, designed for 27 emerging artists. Throughout the program, participants collaborate with like-minded peers, create and develop a new work, and learn from leading industry mentors through creative development workshops. Nine directors, nine writers and nine actors are selected from hundreds of applicants to work towards a public outcome.

C.R.U.S.H BY CROSSROAD ARTS

Our ongoing partnership with Crossroad Arts (Mackay) continued in 2023 with La Boite Teaching Artist, Madeleine Lewis, representing the company while facilitating three days of professional skills development workshops in contemporary movement, performance and theatre making for d/Deaf and/or disabled and/or neurodivergent artists nationally. This partnership celebrates the power of communities, collaborations and professional theatrical experiences for all.



VENUE ACTIVITIES

VENUE HIRE

In addition to our own artistic programming, La Boite continued to welcome commercial and community venue hires into the Roundhouse Theatre, La Boite Studio and Forecourt.

Across the year, La Boite hosted over 50 performances and events through venue hire activities which were attended by over 10,000 patrons. La Boite engaged with over 50 individual technicians and front of house staff to assist in the delivery of our projects and activities.

La Boite remains firmly committed to providing support to the wider Brisbane arts community, local businesses, not-for-profits, charities and NGOs, providing over \$125,000 of in-kind support in 2023.

La Boite remains a proud member of Live Performance Australia and Stage Queensland and is an active participant in discussions of consultation and advocacy.

OPERATIONS

BOX OFFICE

As a member of the Tessitura Network, La Boite continues to deliver in-house ticketing services for all events and activities within our venues, ensuring we can be flexible and responsive to patron requests and external users of the venue, and streamlining our ticketing, fundraising, marketing and customer relationship management.

Participating in the LPA's Ticketing Code of Practice Review, La Boite remains committed to upholding industry standards, enhancing transparency, and contributing to the ongoing improvement of ticketing practices within the live performance sector.

ESPRESSO BAR & CAFÉ

La Boite continues to grow our food & beverage arm, operating our Espresso Bar and Café during the day and for performances and events, serving over 16,000 patrons in 2023.

YOUTH & EDUCATION

MULTICULTURAL YOUNG ARTIST PROGRAM

MYAP was a Multicultural Youth Arts enrichment program designed to provide space, education, recreational and social activities for students aged 11 – 19 years.

Facilitated by La Boite's Teaching Artists and supported by Multicultural Australia (MA) and the Queensland Program of Assistance to Survivors of Torture and Trauma (QPASTT), the program delivered theatre workshops for young people from refugee and migrant backgrounds to foster leadership, confidence, communication and build a sense of cultural identity and self-expression.

La Boite is committed to creating outstanding and transformative experiences for young people from diverse cultural and language backgrounds.

Through MYAP, La Boite has engaged the next generation of refugee and migrant storytellers and leaders, nurturing them into future facilitators, storytellers and artists.

TEACHERS ADVISORY GROUP

In 2023 our Teachers Advisory Group (TAG) was reassembled and commenced quarterly meetings. They have been an invaluable resource to La Boite in terms of advising us on major curriculum changes and how Theatre can best intersect with the needs of educators and their students. We will continue this collaborative relationship into 2024, and will be in conversation with our TAG members to look at how our seasons can continually improve to align with the rhythms of assessment and the interests of the educators in our community.

THE WELCOME

Stories Of Belonging, *The Welcome* is a lifeaffirming collection of short films sharing stories that will transport you across countries, borders and oceans.

Hear fresh voices and emerging Queensland artists from diverse backgrounds tell honest and authentic stories about migrant and refugee experiences and what it means to belong in Australia.

The Welcome was available to every Student and Teacher nationally, aligned to the general capabilities of Intercultural Understanding as part of the Australian Curriculum. This has been made possible through the generous support of the Queensland Government and the Department of Children, Youth Justice and Multicultural Affairs.


