As Australia's oldest professional theatre company, La Boite has been energising artists and audiences for almost 100 years. During this time, the Company has been a time capsule for the Australian voice. Working on the lands of the Jagera and Turrbal people, our vision is to re-birth the new Australian voice over the next hundred years to be the Country's most diverse theatre company.

We will do this by developing and profiling new voices and artists, and sharing stories that promote cultural equity, social improvement, and interrogate moral and spiritual values and individual and collective responsibility.

La Boite's role in the local, state, and national arts sector is critical to the pipeline of new Australian work. We have a dedicated focus on the sustainability of Queensland-based arts practice and have an undeniable track record of nurturing artists to make the transition from emerging to established. La Boite interrogates the boundaries of theatre, creating pathways for local and national artists to mainstream stages in Brisbane and beyond.

La Boite remains determined to increasingly **uncover and reveal untold stories from the voices of the oppressed and underprivileged**. We provide a platform for the Traditional Owners of the land, the Other, the Stranger, and the rejected. Sharing stories from diverse perspectives is a powerful way to encourage and promote cultural empathy.

From the work we deliver, to the community engagement we undertake, to the make-up of our team, **La Boite has its sight set on being the most culturally relevant theatrical institution in the country**.



CHAIR'S REPORT

Adam Brunes

It's remarkable that a near 100-year-old organisation continues to experience so many firsts. As La Boite rockets towards its centenary in just three years' time, 2022 saw the organisation take a number of vital steps in preparation.

Key to this was the appointment of the inimitable Courtney Stewart as La Boite's 18th Artistic Director in July 2022. Courtney is a revered and respected theatre artist and leader and is uniquely qualified to spearhead La Boite's vision to be Australia's most diverse theatre company. It's particularly poignant that a proud and passionate Brisbanite will steward the organisation into its second century of operation and beyond.

We also saw the fruits of La Boite's trailblazing Artist Company, generously supported by the Federal Government's RISE fund, which allowed us to dream big across our mainstage season with two huge world premiere ensemble productions in Lewis Treston's An Ideal Husband and Anita Heiss's Tiddas. What a thrill it was to see large casts at La Boite in full flight! This year also saw us pioneer a powerful new national partnership with Australian Plays Transform, providing 10 playwrights with a three-day play development to evolve their work to the next stage, including access to actors and creatives from the La Boite Artist Company. This trailblazing program culminated with a showcase of five new Australian works at La Boite's Roundhouse Theatre and we are proud to progress Cut Chilli by Chenturan Aran to the mainstage in 2023.

2022 brought some significant farewells including the departure of Executive Director and CEO Zohar Spatz, whose three-year tenure amidst unfathomable global disruption was truly inspiring. In November, we also mourned the loss of La Boite icon and Queensland theatre royalty Muriel Watson, whose devotion and generosity to La Boite spanned more than 60 years. Proving all good things must come to an end, Julian Myers retired as Chair in December 2022 following 11 remarkable years of service as a La Boite Board Director, including seven years as Chair. Julian's love and loyalty to La Boite remains and it's an honour to follow in his footsteps.

La Boite is a place of possibility and purpose and it's our supporters who make it so. To our government stakeholders, corporate partners and big-hearted individual backers, we simply couldn't do this without you. Thank you for believing in this vital and vibrant company, and here's cheers to another stellar year of theatre in the year ahead.



ARTISTIC DIRECTOR / CEO'S REPORT

Courtney Stewart

Ninety-seven years of existence in an ever-changing landscape takes resilience and ingenuity. Last year, La Boite saw the final instalment of The Artist Company, an initiative that allowed the company to make productions of scale, develop new Australian plays, and interrogate contemporary Artistic leadership models.

This was an invaluable learning experience for La Boite and revealed how important a concise and consolidated vision is to the sustainability of our company. The learnings garnered during this period laid the groundwork for the reinstatement of the Artistic Director position at the company – one that I am privileged to be custodian of as we forge ahead to our 100th year of operation in 2025. 2022 continued to see the changing of the guard at our company with the appointment of Adam Brunes as Chair of the Board. Having Adam's expertise as one of the most accomplished and connected marketing, producing, and business minds in the state will be an invaluable asset to our management team as we continue to hone our strategy to ensure our artists and our company thrive.

In 2022, we developed more than 20 new Australian plays by writers from across the nation and worked with more than 120 artists through our Artist Development programs. Out of our four mainstage shows, two were new Australian works that were originally commissioned by La Boite. In 2023, we will premiere four diverse new Australian works. We spotlight a voice from the Kabi Kabi (Sunshine Coast) and Butchulla (Fraser Coast) communities, explore the adoptee experience in Australia, interrogate the origins of the Chinese diaspora, and celebrate the LGBTQIA+ community. Three of these plays were initially supported through La Boite's development programs and it is gratifying and imperative that these new voices are given a full production on the Australian mainstage.

As we head into 2023, we have new challenges to face as we continue to recover from the last three years of business disruption. La Boite will face these challenges head on through the crucial work we program, a targeted and dynamic audience development and retention strategy, and **our unrelenting mission to change the world, one story at a time.**



We were thrilled to continue to showcase our incredibly talented group of artists, the La Boite Artist Company in 2022. Working across our Mainstage Season, Artist Development Programs, and providing teaching opportunities with Youth and Education, they embodied the vision and ecology of La Boite Theatre.

We were privileged to see our Artist Company Directors take works to the stage with Darren Yap bringing musicals back to La Boite with *The Last Five Years*, Nadine McDonald-Dowd bringing *Tiddas* to stage after three years in development and Nigel Poulton providing vital Intimacy / Fight / Movement Direction across three of our four Mainstage works.

The La Boite Artist Company enabled the company to dream big across our Mainstage season, with large casts taking the stage in true ensemble shows. We were able to showcase six of our talented actors in *An Ideal Husband* by Lewis Treston and across *Tiddas*.

These artists were also busy behind the scenes, providing their knowledge and skills to national playwrights as a part of our La Boite x Australian Plays Transform partnership and our Artist Development program.

Funded by the Australian Government's Arts and Cultural Development Program: Restart Investment to Sustain and Expand (RISE) fund, the La Boite Artist Company initiative began in a time where artists were faced with serious impacts to the arts industry due to COVID-19. While 2022 continued to provide challenges for artists and companies, we were grateful to have the opportunity to support artists and experiment with a new model of working across 2021-2022.

In 2022, La Boite embarked in a brand new National partnership with Australian Plays Transform to provide opportunities for playwrights and their plays.

ARTIST DEVELOPMENT

Assistant Creatives

La Boite's Assistant Creatives Program provides the opportunity for individuals to engage in industry mentorship within our Mainstage program.

The mission of this program is to provide a connection between emerging and experienced creatives, provide learning opportunities within a Mainstage context and upskill the Brisbane creative community.

The Creative Assistant positions are paid, commensurate with working part-time over a four-week rehearsal period. During each production, the Assistant Creatives shadow their mentor across rehearsal, production week and (if appropriate) throughout the season.

In 2022, La Boite provided four individuals mentorship across our Mainstage Program. Each of the Assistant Creatives proved their capability and skill in this professional development opportunity, and we look forward to seeing their success in the future.

La Boite Commissioned Work

Congratulations! Get Rich by Merlynn Tong

La Boite Artist Company's Merlynn Tong poses the question of whether you can truly escape your past in this exciting new musical theatre work. Set in a Karaoke Lounge on the night before Chinese New Year, this work uses stories, showmanship and songs to explore relationships between the living and the past.

Beautiful Country and The Good Dad by David Burton

Through his time with La Boite Artist Company, David Burton produced an initial draft of *Beautiful Country*, a work which explores a story compelled by the harsh experience of Baby Asha, and an initial draft of *The Good Dad*, a one-man comedy.

Tacky by Ellen van Neerven

As a part of the Artist Company, and with the support of Nadine McDonald-Dowd, Ellen van Neerven produced an initial draft of *Tacky*, a work that explores the dichotomy of age, gender, youth and experience with an all First Nations cast.

Supported Projects

YOKE by Aha Ensemble

YOKE, a disability-led dance-theatre work, returned to La Boite for a two-week development. After their initial development and showing in 2021, Aha Ensemble revisited the work to refine and shape the series of interconnected partner works with the support of Leisel Zink.

The Great Emu War by Paul Hodge and Cal Silberstein

The Great Emu War is a brand new musical that highlights a unique part of Australian History, which celebrated its 90th anniversary in 2022. This three-day development connected Darren Yap to the project to further explore the theatrical elements with the cast, writers and musical directors.

Capricorn by Aidan Rowlingson

Queensland Performing Arts Centre (QPAC) and La Boite collaborated to support a one-week development of *Capricorn* by Aidan Rowlingson. This work has been previously supported by the Sparks program with QPAC and PlayLab and through Yellamundie Festival by Moogahlin Performing Arts Inc. La Boite is excited to continue this partnership with QPAC to bring this work to the Mainstage in 2023.

Skills Development Program

La Boite launched a new Behind-the-Curtain Masterclass Series which gave artists the opportunity to see processes in action. These Masterclass events featured audition-style experience that provided a window into the learning processes experiences within rehearsal rooms and beyond. The events included:

C.R.U.S.H by Crossroad Arts

Our ongoing partnership with Crossroad Arts (Mackay) continued in 2022 with La Boite's Youth and Education Producer, Ari Palani, facilitating three days of professional skills development workshops in contemporary movement, performance and theatre making for d/Deaf and/or disabled and/or neurodiverse artists nationally. *C.R.U.S.H* is suitable for all ages, bodies, minds and levels of artistic experience, and in 2022 participants doubled to 76. This ongoing partnership celebrates the power of communities, collaborations and professional theatrical experiences for all.

Stage to Screen: Incubator and Pitching Event

In 2022, La Boite and Screen Queensland continued our partnership, which saw the return of the Stage to Screen Incubator program that allowed the opportunity for six Playwrights to build integral skills to help pitch their work to the film industry.

The week-long incubator in February 2022 was guided by Industry Facilitators, Diya Eid and Stephen Lance and supported with mentorship sessions with Krissy Kneen, Stephanie Dower and Andrew Knight.

In November 2022, four of the participants were given the opportunity to pitch their work live to an industry panel. This event was presented by La Boite, Screen Queensland and Brisbane International Film Festival, and featured SQ's Lucy Markovich as facilitator, with an industry panel including: Veronica Fury (Wild Bear Productions), Matt Pearson (Story Bridge Films) and Richard Jameson (Wirram Media).

Let's Break Up is a multidisciplinary work by award-winning poet and founder of Brisbane-based collective Voices of Colour, Anisa Nandaula, which combines stand-up comedy and spoken word to interrogate the world through the personal, political and hilarious.

A one-woman work that centers Anisa's interpersonal relationships with friends, family, lovers, and so-called Australia to explore a range of critical issues, including race, feminism, and contemporary politics.

ATYP and Fresh Ink works

La Boite and Australian Theatre For Young People (ATYP) partnered together to deliver the Fresh Ink National Mentoring Program for emerging writers. La Boite's Youth and Education Producer Ari Palani worked with esteemed Dramaturg Saffron Benner and the ATYP team to provide an 8-month development program with four writers to further their chosen scripts.

Monthly mentorship meetings allowed for ongoing script development culminating in an invited reading in July and a public showcase in November 2022.

YOUTH & EDUCATION

La Boite is committed to providing experiencedefining educational opportunities and training for school students, teachers and emerging artists.

Through our dedicated Youth & Education arm, the company aims to connect participants with inventive programs, industry leading professional artists and processes at the forefront of professional theatre practice. Aligning with State and National curricula, we strive to make these offerings as relevant to classrooms and the varied contexts students and teachers find themselves in.

Through passionate dedication to diversity and access, we are committed to creating programs and making scholarship pathways available to those who may experience barriers to inclusion, including but not limited to:

- Long distance travel (more than 40km from La Boite)
- Low income household and/or low ICSEA school score (below 1000)
- Students who identify as culturally and/or linguistically diverse (CALD)
- Students who identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander (ATSI)

For Young and Emerging Artists

School Holiday Program Designed for young performers aged 13-17, to develop their passion for storytelling over three days during school holidays.

Assembly La Boite's Assembly is an eight-week skills development and showcase program, designed for 27 emerging artists. Throughout the program, participants collaborate with like-minded peers, create and develop a new work, and learn from leading industry mentors through creative development workshops. Nine directors, nine writers and nine actors are selected to participate, and work towards a public outcome. This includes six masterclasses, one intensive full day rehearsal culminating in a public outcome.

For Classrooms

\$5 Add-on Program Aiming to maximise students' in-theatre experience, our \$5 add-on program includes an entertaining and exclusive Q&A with cast and creatives post-show.

Student Workshops Offered either in-theatre or in-school, our student workshops are delivered by industry professionals aligning with style, form and conventions.

Digital Program Syllabus-aligned production and workshop recordings allow teachers and students to engage with the magic of live theatre, without leaving their classroom.

EBUCKATION

Multicultural Young Artist Program (MYAP)

MYAP is a creative enrichment program designed for people aged 11-19 years, for educational, recreational and social activities through intercultural, multimodal and multilingual delivery.

Specifically designed to support young people from refugee and migrant backgrounds, the program promotes literacy and numeracy, self-expression, leadership and confidence in their new communities whilst resettling. Storytelling is a key component to building a sense of belonging and fostering our contemporary cultural identities. In 2022, 223 participants with origins in 22+ countries were engaged.

Facilitated by a team of Teaching Artists with lived resettlement experiences and supported by Multicultural Australia and the Queensland Program of Assistance to Survivors of Torture and Trauma (QPASTT), MYAP centres and celebrates Australia's next generation of stories and storytellers across our stages.

Case Study

Growing upon the success of *The Neighbourhood* in 2020 and supported by a strategy of digital delivery, La Boite partnered with the Queensland Government's Department of Local Government, Racing and Multicultural Affairs, and Commonwealth Bank, to deliver a life-affirming collection of short films for Multicultural Month 2021 and beyond. The films were specifically curated for Queenslanders across all regions to:

- · Promote Queensland's cultural and linguistic diversity
- Provide positive narratives around diversity and inclusion in Queensland
- And increase intercultural understanding based on the real stories of belonging from diverse Queenslanders.

With the creative collaboration of Brisbane-based internationally-focused television production company KIOSK, these nine short stories and core film premiered online as a free digital resource. In 2021-22 these screened across multiple digital platforms, international film festivals and were showcased in the Australian Pavilion at the EXPO 2020 Dubai.

- 75% of viewers located in regional Australia, with the highest viewership originating from Queensland

In 2022 these works have become packaged with professional development workshops designed and presented for teachers and students to aid in supporting learning around a key pillar in the Australian Curriculum (F-10) Intercultural Understanding. This program will ensure that all school students in Queensland and nationally will have access to first-hand stories and cultural competency development opportunities free of charge.

Over 2021 and 2022 La Boite partnered with Blaklash Creative to deliver *dhagun*.

dhagun is a yearlong outdoor exhibition integrating First Nations voices and creative responses to Country, demonstrated through digital design, installation, video projection, lightboxes and live performance. dhagun is a Yuggera language word meaning earth, place or country.

La Boite is committed to activating our forecourt area and building to be a more supportive space for free public art, performances and community activities. dhagun and La Boite's outdoor activities in 2021 and 2022 were funded by Arts Queensland's COVID-19 Recovery Open Air Fund and Brisbane City Council.

VENUE ACTIVITIES

Venue Hire

In addition to our own program, La Boite continued to welcome commercial and community venue hires into the Roundhouse Theatre, La Boite Studio and La Boite Forecourt.

Across the year, La Boite hosted a total of 48 performances and events through venue hire activities which were attended by over 8,000 patrons. La Boite engaged with 50 individual technicians and front of house staff to assist in the delivery of our projects and activities.

La Boite remains committed to providing support to the wider Brisbane arts community, local businesses, not-for-profits, charities, and NGOs. In addition to our commercial venue hires, La Boite Theatre provided over \$85,000 of in-kind support to the Brisbane arts community.

La Boite remains a member of Live Performance Australia and Stage Queensland, and is an active participant in discussions of consultation and advocacy.
